In the first hour, groups will take a guided tour of the island, including Perry's Lookout, the glacial grooves, Stone Lab buildings, and the outside of Cooke Castle. The second hour will focus on the Lake Erie research currently being conducted at Stone Lab.

Visit the South Bass Island Lighthouse, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and learn about its history and the area's historical shipwrecks. Don't forget to climb the stairs to the lighthouse tower for a great view of the island. The grounds are open to the public dawn to dusk free of charge (unless otherwise posted).
